Peer Support South East Ontario (PSSEO)

The Centres offer safe, non-judgmental, non-clinical peer support, wellness-based groups and activities, free lunch/laundry/coffee, computer access, and harm reduction services (needle exchange and naxolone).

EMERGENCY SHELTER RESOURCES

21 bed emergency shelter for adult guests ages 18 and over, who are experiencing homelessness. Guests can stay at the shelter for up to 30 consecutive nights with a 7 day service break in between, where they can have their basic needs met including:

- access to showers and laundry services
